Why do we work on freedom of expression, assembly, and association on campus?

We hear about banned, cancelled, or restricted campus events or on-campus protests every day. However, a significant number of these violations cannot be reported or reach the public and, therefore, cannot become visible. The voices of some of us cannot reach all of us.

In this context, we have been conducting studies on violations of freedom of expression, assembly, and association on university campuses since our founding. We see campuses and student activism as a part of the civil space, and we aim to make the rights violations visible in this area and to show solidarity with students subjected to these violations.

Disseminate the achievements gained on campuses,




Conduct interviews with students regarding their agenda and demands,

We established the Voice of the University News Portal to create a sustainable platform where students who are subject to violations can make their voices heard, inform the public about what is happening on campus, and at the same time, while experienced journalists can provide workshops to students who want to improve their knowledge and skills in this field.





Legal support and trial monitoring



We provide legal support and produce informative content on legal procedures to support students who are investigated, prosecuted, or face disciplinary punishment due to a meeting, march, or event they attended on campus.

As we enter our 5th year, we are also happy to have taken steps to create a network of lawyers who follow student trials. Following the workshops we organized in Diyarbakır, Izmir, Ankara, and Istanbul, we are building the foundation for a network that can quickly communicate in case of trials, take action, and share exemplary decisions.

We are trying to make on-campus violations visible and raise public opinion on this issue, especially by following the prosecutions of students whose rights have been violated and who have faced legal sanctions while advocating for rights on campuses.

On-campus citizen journalism and international protection mechanisms workshops

As part of student activism and promoting freedom of expression on campus, we organized workshops on Citizen Journalism and International Protection Mechanisms On Campus. As a result of the workshops, we produced two separate videos and prepared brochures for students. You can access these contents on our website.





Open(the)Space

We organized a series of workshops with the Nonviolent Education and Research Center. In these workshops, we expressed the discomfort of our shrinking space through art and expanded the limits of the spaces where we come together.


videocampaigns

While university students are building new ways of struggle and solidarity against oppressive policies, we believe in the importance of keeping this solidarity and hope alive, and we strive to reflect this in our campaigns.

We started a campaign called #YasağaRağmen (**#DespiteTheBan**) to highlight students' struggles on campus, on the streets, and even in disaster areas. We ran the #HakkınVar (**#YouHaveTheRight**) video campaign to highlight the different achievements of students on campus.

We carried out a campaign called #HerHaldeHaklarımızVar (#WeHaveRights) to remind that many rights, such as the right to education, housing, and the freedom to gather and organize on campus still exist against the arbitrary practices taken after the earthquake and the pandemic, and to strengthen the students who are struggling.









Freedom of expression on campus report: "Campus to be handcuffed"

In this human rights monitoring study, we aimed to record what happened on campuses after the pandemic regarding the right to association and peaceful assembly in the context of freedom of expression and to reveal the factors that prevent using these rights.

We conducted a study called "Freedom of Expression on Campus" to strengthen student activism at universities in Turkey and contribute to its sustainability. As a result, we published a
